



1. Locate and mark the cities of Jerusalem, Damascus, Antioch (in Phoenicia), and Tarsus on the First Missionary Journey map.
2. Locate and mark the cities of Thessalonika and Corinth on the Second Missionary Journey map.
3. Draw two arrows from Corinth to Thessalonika to represent the letters to the Thessalonians. Write the names of these letters below the map.
4. Locate and mark the cities of Corinth and Ephesus and the regions of Macedonia and Galatia on the Third Missionary Journey map. Galatia is not marked on the map, but is the blank area immediately below Bithynia.

5. Draw an arrow from Ephesus to Corinth to represent the first letter to Corinth.
6. Draw an arrow from Macedonia to Corinth to represent the second letter to Corinth.
7. Draw an arrow from Corinth to Galatia to represent the letter to the Galatians.
8. Draw an arrow from Corinth northwest toward Rome to represent the letter to the Romans. Write the names of these letters in order below the map.
9. Locate and mark the cities of Rome, Ephesus, Philippi and Colossae on the Fourth Missionary Journey map (look at the Third Journey map to find Philippi and Colossae). Also locate the region of Macedonia and the island of Crete.
10. Draw two arrows from Rome to Colossae to represent the letters to Philemon and to the Colossians.
11. Draw an arrow from Rome to Ephesus to represent the letter to the Ephesians.
12. Draw an arrow from Rome to Philippi to represent the letter to the Philippians.
13. Draw an arrow from Macedonia to Ephesus to represent the first letter to Timothy.
14. Draw an arrow from Macedonia to the island of Crete to represent the letter to Titus.
15. Draw an arrow from Rome to Ephesus to represent the second (and last) letter to Timothy. Write the names of these letters in order below the map.

Refer to the Timeline for the following actions:

1. What major events took place in Paul's life before the First Missionary Journey? Note them briefly in the margin to the left of the First Journey map.
2. What major historical event took place between the First and Second journeys? Note it briefly between the First and Second Journey maps.
3. What major historical event took place between the Third Journey and Paul's journey to Rome under guard? Note it briefly in the space between the Third Journey and the Captive Journey maps.
4. What may have happened to Paul (according to Conybeare and Howson's research) following the events depicted on the Captive Journey map? Note it briefly in the margin to the right of the Captive Journey map.
5. What chapters in the Book of Acts correspond to each map? Write them on each map near the legend.

Final Question: Why were Paul's letters placed in the Bible in the order they were, and not chronologically?
