Christ and His Word



CCSC is built on the foundation of Christ and His Word

We want you and your family to grow stronger as Christians, and we are making this faith and commitment packet available to all who are currently part of our Calvary Chapel Space Coast (CCSC) church family (and to those who are interested in becoming part of the CCSC church family).

Studying what the Bible has to say about our faith and about our commitment to Christ and our church family is important. The Bible is our instruction book for our Christian life. Sometimes we can get away without reading the directions, but if we refuse to read the directions on a complicated project, we can get off track and mess up big time! Well, believe us, human beings are complicated, and God knew we needed a direction book!



We need to share **a common faith** in Christ and in God's Word in order for us to be like minded as a church body (Rom 15:5). We have therefore put together a statement of faith which reflects our beliefs as a church family.

We also need to share **a common commitment** to one another as a church family (Phil 2:2). Acts 2:38-47 mentions five key characteristics of a healthy church:

- a church that boldly proclaims Christ
- a church that praises God constantly
- a church that prays for others instantly
- a church that proves its love daily
- a church that generously provides for its own.

These five areas are displayed on the banners in our church sanctuary as a reminder to ourselves of where our focus needs to be as a church family.

We want to have a Common Faith in Christ and His Word

Our CCSC Statement of Faith- Part 1

Calvary Chapel Space Coast is a fellowship of believers under the Lordship of Jesus Christ, and we share a common purpose; to glorify God as individuals, as families, and as a congregation. Our mission is to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ, to teach the Word of God, and to help each other grow in faith and obedience to God's Word.

It is therefore essential that we share a common understanding of God's Word, and what it teaches about important matters. Please take the time to read through what we believe as a church fellowship. You may not fully understand everything on the next two pages, but ***it is important*** for you to let church leadership know if you have any concerns.

THE BIBLE

WE BELIEVE that the BIBLE is the only inspired, infallible, and authoritative Word of God, and is profitable for doctrine (showing us God's ways), for reproof (showing us when we're off track), for correction (showing us how to get back on track), and for instruction in righteousness (showing us how to stay on track), that the man and woman of God may be perfect, thoroughly equipped for every good work. (Note: There are a number of good translations. Our Pastor teaches from the New King James Translation on Sunday mornings, and we provide free Bibles to all who need them.)
(2 Timothy 3:16-17, 2 Peter 1:21)

GOD'S NATURE AND THE GODHEAD

WE BELIEVE that there is one living and true God, eternally existing in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, equal in power and glory, and that this triune God created, upholds and governs all things. He performs His will among the armies of heaven and the inhabitants of the earth. He is slow to anger, and abounding in mercy.
(Genesis 1:1, Daniel 4:35, Romans 1:21, Colossians 2:9)

THE FATHER

WE BELIEVE IN GOD THE FATHER, an infinite, personal Spirit perfect in holiness, wisdom, power, and love, and that He concerns Himself mercifully in the affairs of men. **WE BELIEVE** that He hears and answers prayer, and that He saves from sin and death all who come to Him through Jesus Christ. (1 Cor. 8:8, John 3:16, Psalm 6:9)

THE SON

WE BELIEVE IN JESUS CHRIST, God's only begotten Son, conceived by the Holy Spirit. **WE BELIEVE** in His virgin birth, in His sinless life, and in His miracles and teaching. **WE BELIEVE** in His **substitutionary atoning death, His bodily resurrection**, and His ascension into heaven where He sits at the right hand of the Father. **WE BELIEVE** in His future personal, visible return to earth, and the establishment of His Kingdom on earth.
(John 3:16, Matt. 1:23, 1 cor. 15:4, Hebrews 9:15, mark 13:24-37)

THE HOLY SPIRIT

WE BELIEVE IN THE HOLY SPIRIT, who **convicts, regenerates, sanctifies**, and **indwells** us as our abiding Helper, Teacher, and Guide. **WE BELIEVE** that by one Spirit we are all baptized into one body of Christ, and that He gives every believer spiritual gifts as He wills for the **edification** of the body of Christ. We also believe that the Holy Spirit empowers us to be Christ's witnesses to the world, and that believers are commanded to be filled with the Holy Spirit. **WE BELIEVE** that being Spirit-filled results in us boldly proclaiming Christ and manifesting the fruit of the Holy Spirit in our daily lives.
(2 Tim. 1:13-14, John 14:12, 1 Cor. 12)

Our CCSC Statement of Faith- Part 2

SIN AND SALVATION

WE BELIEVE that all have sinned and come short of the glory of God; that the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord; that God commended His love toward us, that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us; that we are called to repent of our sins and be baptized, trusting in the Lord Jesus for our salvation; and that whoever calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved. There is no other name by which men may be saved.

(Romans 3:23, 6:23, 5:8, Acts 2:38, Romans 10:13, Acts 4:12)

GRACE AND GODLINESS

WE BELIEVE that we are saved by grace through faith, and that not of ourselves, it is a gift of God. **WE BELIEVE** that we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to perform good works in accordance with God's plan. **WE BELIEVE** that all things work together for the good to those who love the Lord and are the called according to His purpose, and that He has predestined us to become conformed to the image of His Son.

(Ephesians 2:8-10, Romans 8:28-29)

BAPTISM AND THE NEW COVENANT

WE BELIEVE that we must obey and teach others to obey the commandments of Christ, which are to believe on the Son of God and to love God and one another as He commanded us. **WE BELIEVE** in following the early church practice of professing our faith in the waters of baptism and remembering Christ's sacrifice and the new **covenant** in His blood through communion together. It is not the waters of baptism that save us however, but the answer of a good conscience toward God. All we like sheep have gone astray, yet the Lord laid on Him the **iniquity** of us all.

Mt. 28:29-20, 1 John 3:23, 1 Corinthians 11:25, 1 Peter 3:21, 2:24-25)

THE BODY OF CHRIST

WE BELIEVE the New Testament church is the body of Christ, and that it demonstrates God's love in five critical ways: proclaiming Christ to others boldly, praying with one another instantly, proving and **exhorting** one another daily, providing for the Calvary Chapel Space Coast fellowship generously, and in praising God in all circumstances. **WE BELIEVE** that Christ commanded this '**agape**' love for one another, and that without this love we have no right to even claim ourselves Christians.

(John 13:34-35, 1 Corinthians 12:13)

WORSHIP

WE BELIEVE that both personal and corporate worship (worship as an assembly of believers) are important. Worship should be from our heart, and yet grounded in God's truth. The Holy Spirit applies God's Word to us through worship and changes us.

(Ephesians 5:19-20, Colossians 3:15-16)

God has asked us to Act on Our Faith By Taking Three Important Steps

Many of you that attend our church believe the statements of faith we have just listed, but we want to make sure that you have acted on your faith. To believe in Christ, means more than believe what you read about Him. To believe in Christ means to trust in Him completely for your salvation.

Believe that Jesus, God's only son, paid the full penalty for our sins when He died on the cross, that He rose from the dead, and that we are saved through faith, not by what we do for God, but by what Christ did for us.- John 3:16, Eph. 2:8-9

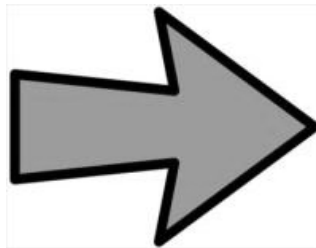

Have You Acted on Your Faith By Repenting?



Have You Repented and Received Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior? Have you ever made the decision to repent of your sins and trust completely in the work of Christ for your salvation? If so, when did you do this?

Note: John 1:12 says that ***we must move from just being believers in Jesus, to being receivers***, in order to become the children of God.

At some point each of us must make a decision with respect to Jesus. We must decide whether we are going to turn from our sin (the Bible calls this repentance), and make a commitment to trust in Jesus Christ for our salvation, and to obey His commandments as our Lord and Savior. A single man and a single woman can spend a lot of time together without making a commitment to marry one another and spend the rest of their lives as husband and wife. In the same way a person can spend a lot of time learning about God, praying, and even going to church, without making a commitment to trust in Christ alone for their salvation, to obey all of His commandments, and enter into a relationship with Him. We want all of our people here at Calvary Chapel Space Coast to know for certain where they stand with God.

And this is the testimony: that God has given us eternal life, and this life is in His Son. He who has the Son has life; he who does not have the Son of God does not have life. These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life, and that you may *continue to believe* in the name of the Son of God. - 1 John 5:11-13)

If you are not sure where you stand with God, write down some of your doubts or questions:

Note: Romans 3:23, 5:8, 6:23, 10:13, John 1:12, John 3:16, and 1 John 5:13 are good verses about the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Have You Acted On Your Faith By being Publicly Immersed?



Have you Publicly confessed Jesus Christ as your Lord in the waters of baptism. Have you ever been publicly immersed as a testimony that you have committed your life to Jesus Christ? If so, when did you do this?

Read Matthew 28:19-20, Mark 16:16, and Acts 2:38. The New Testament was written in Greek, and the Greek word for 'baptize' means to wash, dip, or immerse. In the Greek Old Testament it is translated "dipped" in 2 Kings 5:14 where Naaman, the king of Syria's general, dipped himself in the river Jordan seven times per the instructions of the prophet Elisha. The Greek Orthodox Church defines baptism as an immersion.

Read Romans 6:3-6. What does water baptism symbolize as we are dipped into the water and brought out again?

Read Matthew 10:32. We are told to confess Christ before men. Why do you think God chose immersion as the way for us to publicly confess Christ?

Note: Sometimes people are not sure about whether they should be immersed later in life because their parents had them christened or dedicated as babies in the church. Fortunately, Jesus gave us an example to follow in this. Jesus was brought to the temple and dedicated as a baby (Luke 2:22-23). But later in life He entered into the river Jordan and was immersed by John the Baptist (Matthew 3:13-17). The Spirit of God descended upon Him and the Father said, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased."

Having babies dedicated to the Lord in the church is a wonderful thing, but the Lord and His apostles told us that it is important for us to proclaim Christ publicly in the water after we commit ourselves to Christ.

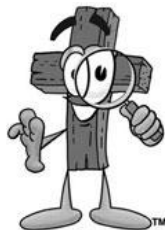

Acts 2:38-47 mentions five key characteristics of a healthy church.

- Proclaim Christ Boldly (Acts 1:8)
- Praise God Constantly regularly (1 Thessalonians 5:16-18)
- Pray for Others Instantly (Romans 12:12)
- Prove our Love Daily (John 13:14-15, 35, Philippians 2:4-5)
- Provide for our church Generously (Proverbs 3:9)

Five Pillars of a Great Church

Pillar One- Proclaim Christ Boldly



Read Psalm 51:5, Jeremiah 17:9, Romans 7:18, Isaiah 64:6.

What does the Bible say about our sinful condition as human beings?

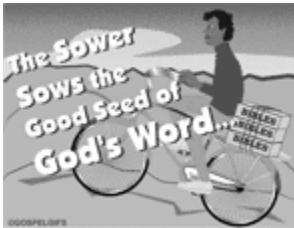
Romans 3:10 says that none of us are good and Romans 3:23 says all of us have sinned and come short of the glory of God. Even though we are sinners, Christ died for us! (Romans 5:8). This is the good news, or gospel of Jesus Christ. He died on the cross for our sins and rose up from the grave to redeem us from the penalty and power of sin.

Romans 10:13 says that whoever calls on the Lord will be saved. But how is anyone going to call on the Lord if they don't hear about Him? And how are they going to hear about Him if no one proclaims Him?

Read Romans 10:14-17. This word 'preacher' in the Bible actually means 'proclaimer'; that is, someone that proclaims, or tells people about Jesus. All Christians should proclaim that God demonstrated His love for sinners, and sent His only son, Jesus, to die on the cross for our sins (John 3:16, Romans, 5:8); that Christ rose from the grave on the third day, and ascended to heaven (1 Corinthians 15:3-4, Acts 1:9-11); that whoever believes this in their heart, and calls on the Lord, WILL BE SAVED! (Romans 10:8-13).

Aren't you glad that someone in your life PROCLAIMED CHRIST to you? Write down some of the people in your life that have proclaimed Christ to you through the years:

When did you fully understand that salvation was not something that could be earned, but that it was a gift to be received by calling on the Lord?



Spread the Word

Remember how we started our discussion on proclaiming Christ? How are people supposed to call on the Lord if they don't hear the message of God's call to repent and trust in Christ for their salvation?

Repenting of our sin and being baptized is only the beginning! God has called us to accomplish a mission, and that is to proclaim Christ to the whole world! Read Matthew 28:19-20 and Mark 16:15-16.

Why are we supposed to proclaim Christ to everyone?

In Matthew 13:1-9 Jesus taught a parable about a sower that went forth to sow seed. In 13:18-23 He explains the parable. We are to sow the seed of God's Word throughout the world. Some people won't understand it. Some will receive the message with joy at first, but will lose heart when times get tough. Some will be led astray by the cares of the world. But others will grow in the Lord, and will bear much fruit for Him.

Are you one of those that will bear much fruit for Him?

Are you willing to find ways to proclaim Christ to your family, friends, co-workers, and neighbors?

What are some of the ways that you can share Christ with them?

May the Lord fill with you His Holy Spirit and empower you to continuously find opportunities and ways to proclaim Christ boldly.



Pillar Two- Praise God Constantly



Praising and worshipping God is something we do as individuals, but it is very important to praise and worship as a church family.

The Word of God tells us that we are to sing with each other as an expression of our gratitude for God's many blessings.

“speaking to one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing and making melody in your heart to the Lord, *giving thanks* always for all things to God the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ”- Eph 5:19-20

Worshipping God with a heart of gratitude will bring great peace into your life, and into the life of our church family.

“And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to which also you were called in one body; and be thankful. *Let the word of Christ dwell in* you richly in all wisdom, *teaching and admonishing one another* in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord. “- Col 3:15-16

Worship can and does bring the peace of God to our hearts when we do it with a thankful spirit. It is important that we not only sing to God from our hearts, but that we sing with one another. Our songs should give thanks to the Lord and should contain the truth of the Word of God. As we sing the truth of the Word of God together it will teach us, and even gently correct us.

Therefore by Him let us continually offer the sacrifice of praise to God, that is, the fruit of *our* lips, giving thanks to His name.
(Heb 13:15)

Commit to worshipping regularly with your church family. Plan ahead so that your family can arrive early enough to be seated when worship begins.

Remember, praise and worship is an important activity for our church family to participate in TOGETHER.



Pillar Three- Pray for others Instantly



Stop, and take the time to pray

It is important to take time to pray, and it is important to take time to pray with, and for other people.

Therefore I exhort first of all that supplications, prayers, intercessions, **and** giving of thanks be made **for all men** . . . , that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence. For this *is* good and acceptable in the sight of God our Savior, (1Ti 2:1-3)

Everyone needs prayer, and like worship, prayer brings peace into our lives. Have you heard the saying, “A family that prays together stays together”? There is a lot of truth in that. Prayer is not only important because God tells us to pray, but prayer does bring God’s peace and direction into our lives.

It is important that you pray privately, with your family at home, and with your church family. Not everyone feels comfortable praying out loud, but try to do so, as praying out loud blesses those people around you. Just remember, that the power of prayer is not in saying the right words, but in having the right heart.

Is anyone among you suffering? Let him pray. Is anyone cheerful? Let him sing psalms. . . . Confess *your* trespasses to one another, and pray for one another, that you may be healed. The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much. (Jas 5:13, 16)

And remember that there is never a wrong time to pray. The Bible tells us to pray without ceasing and in every circumstance to give thanks, for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for us (1Th 5:17-18).

Don’t forget that there are many ways you can bless people with your prayers. You can say a prayer for them over the phone, in a parking lot, in a front yard after a visit, or even send them a prayer in a letter or e-mail.

Prayer changes things, and prayer changes US!



Pillar Four- Prove your love daily



Serve Your Church Family

Jesus did not come to be served, but to serve. “Just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many.” (Mat 20:28)

How important is it to prove your love by serving your church family?

Jesus said it is one of the main ways that we show others that we are truly followers of Jesus Christ. He said, “By this all will know that you are My disciples, if you have love for one another.” (John 13:35)

God said it is the way you can truly become transformed as a Christ follower.

I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, *which is* your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what *is* that good and acceptable and perfect will of God . . . For as we have many members in one body, but all the members do not have the same function, so we, *being* many, are one body in Christ, and individually members of one another. Having then gifts differing according to the grace that is given to us, *let us use them:*
(Romans 12:1-6)

Our job is not to criticize our church family, but to pitch in and serve our church family. “For you, brethren, have been called to liberty; only do not *use* liberty as an opportunity for the flesh, **but through love serve one another**. . . But if you bite and devour one another, beware lest you be consumed by one another! I say then: Walk in the Spirit” (Gal 5:13-16)

One way you demonstrate your love for someone is by serving them in a loving spirit, and putting their needs above your own. We want to help you make a commitment to serve your church family with a loving Christ-like spirit. (Philippians 2:4-5, 7)

“And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as *is* the manner of some, but exhorting *one another*, and so much the more as you see the Day [of Christ’s return] approaching. (Heb 10:23-25)



Opportunities Available to Serve Your CCSC Church Family (You will rotate with people in most volunteer ministry)

Children's Ministry (Talk to Pastor George, our Assistant Pastor over Children's Ministry, or Dana Costello- director of Sunday Children's Ministry)

- Sunday School teachers and helpers

Nursery (see Pastor George)

Guest Services and Greeters. (See Mitch or Linda Bronson). We need people to welcome our guests with a smile when they come in on Sundays, and people that can help them feel comfortable. We need people that can make sure our guests know where bathrooms and nursery are, know how the children's ministry works and where the kids go when, and make sure they get a basket and a bulletin. (We also need people to bring baked goods for the guest baskets.)

Ushers and Counters for Sunday Morning services. (see Gary Griffin).

Media Services (see Pastor Baron)

- **Picture and Video clip takers for the web site, for the pastor's daily blogs, for church services, and for the church directory.**
- **Easy Worship.** We are looking for someone that can lead a team to reintroduce the use of Easy worship during our Sunday morning services. This will require knowing how to set up projector(s), screens, handle the technical difficulties and determine the technical needs, and organizing a setup and takedown team as well as a team to run it during the service. Contact Pastor Baron if you are interested.

Care Ministry Coordinator and Workers- (See Pastor Baron). We need someone to coordinate special care needs for people with temporary needs such as transportation to the doctor, sending cards out, sending flowers to the hospital, or even doing some home or car repairs for single moms or the elderly. **Care ministry workers** are needed who can cook and deliver meals if needed, provide transportation to a doctor if needed, help do minor vehicle work or minor home repair, or send cards or notes.

Pillar Five- Provide for your church generously



Give the First Portion of Your Income

Did you know that God wants you to honor Him with ***the first portion*** of your income as it comes in? The Bible calls this your 'firstfruits', as in Bible days most people got their food from growing crops, and the 'firstfruits' were the first vegetables or grains that were harvested from their fields or gardens.

When the crops were ready to be harvested, God's people would take ***the first portion*** of their harvest and set it aside as an offering to God, BEFORE they used the rest as food for their family. This first portion was called 'firstfruits'. By giving the first portion of your income to God's work, you are acknowledging that He is your provider, and that God is the reason you have life, have a job, and have an income. You are also acknowledging that God's work is more important than the things of this life, and that God should always come first.

Proverbs 3:9 says, "Honor the LORD with your possessions, And with ***the firstfruits*** of all your increase;"

Are you currently setting aside ***the 'firstfruits'*** (i.e., ***first portion***) of your income as it comes in, and giving it to the Lord's work, BEFORE you use the rest of it toward your family's expenses? It is important to set aside a committed portion of our income and faithfully give that portion to our church family when we gather for worship each week. As it says in 1 Chronicles 16:29, we should come to worship God and ***bring our offering with us***. Not the leftovers of what we didn't spend, but ***the first portion*** of our income that we have faithfully set aside as our income comes in.

1 Timothy 5:8 says that it is important for us to provide for our own, and 1 Corinthians 9:14 says that our pastor should be able to count on us to provide for him as the one that oversees our church family and teaches us the Word of God. It is also important to recognize that it is only when we give faithfully that the church family can pay its bills faithfully.

While it is not a requirement for membership to give a tenth of your household income (the Bible calls this tithing), we recommend that you prayerfully consider making this kind of generous commitment to the Lord's work here.



How Big a Portion Should My First Portion Be?

There is no set rule given us in the New Testament, but God does say that it is important to be generous, and that God loves a cheerful giver.

“He who sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and he who sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. So let each one *give* as he purposes in his heart, not grudgingly or of necessity; for God loves a cheerful giver.” (2Co 9:6-7)

Many Christians that have served the Lord over the years believe that setting aside a tithe (or 10%) of your income is a good way to generously give to the Lord’s work. The Bible talks of men of faith such as Abraham giving a tithe (10%) of his increase to the Lord (Genesis 14:20, Hebrews 7:6). The Israelites were required to offer their firstfruits and to give two tithes (20%) to the Levites and the work of God. (Nehemiah 10:37-38, Malachi 3:10).

You have probably heard the ushers on Sunday praying that God would bless the tithes and the offerings.

Ten percent is a good target for a family to aim for. Some families that have been prospered financially may wish to aim even higher. The important thing is that you determine what God would have you give, and that you give generously and faithfully. One of the benefits of giving generously and faithfully to the Lord is that it often causes us to sit down and work out a family budget. If you need help in setting up a family budget, we have men and women that would be glad to assist you.

If you have had difficulty consistently giving to your church due to being out of town, sick, or simply forgetful, we suggest that you prayerfully consider the Online Giving that is available on our church web site. Go to www.calvarychapelspacecoast.org and click on the “Online Giving” button. It will explain to you how it works and answer your questions. It is a good way to make sure the money you have committed to the Lord’s work is given each week.
